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# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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## 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya is dedicated to the glorious memory of "Habraghat Pargana" a revenue village of the erstwhile Bijni Raj State, was formally inaugurated on the auspicious day of 29th August, 1979 with 61 students in Pre University class under the aegis of a Sponsoring & Governing Body with a view to catering to the need of higher education of vast rural backward area bordering Meghalaya state centering round Krishnai pre-dominantly inhabited by people belonging to S.C., S.T., O.B.C., M.O.B.C. and minority communities of alarming socio- economic condition.

The college is located in the vicinity of Krishnai just 1 K.M. South from the N.H.17 is affiliated to **Gauhati University in 1983** and was placed under deficit system of Grants-in- Aid w.e.f. 01-02-1986. The college has got permanent affiliation and has been registered **under 2 (f) & 12 (B) of UGC act 1956** w.e.f. March, 2006.

The college presently is offering TDC/FYUGP Course in Arts stream with Major/Minor in **Arabic, Assamese, Economics, Education, English, History and Political Science**. There are 15 UG Programmes having a total of 530 student Strengths and 21 Teaching Staff and 10 Non-Teaching Staff.

The College is situated in 37.5 Acres of campus area and 7245.32 square meters of Build-Up Area. There are sufficient numbers of building classified into 3 Blocks having 17 numbers of classrooms of which 6 are with ICT enabled and 2 are smart classrooms. There is one Language Lab, two Computer Labs and one Psychological Laboratory, one digital library in the College. Besides it has a wide Play Ground with Court of Badminton, Basketball, and Volleyball, a well equipped Gymnasium, two Hostels, one Canteen, one Seminar Hall and one Conference Hall. The college has signed a series of MoUs and collaborated with different institutions and agencies for student-teachers exchange and promoting research culture. The College has implemented FYUGP under NEP 2020 as per guideline of the affiliating university i.e. Gauhati University w.e.f. academic session 2023-2024. The College has been assessed and accredited by NAAC in 2nd Cycle with Grade B in 2016.

### **Vision**

Our vision is to make the college an ideal Centre of Knowledge and Learning through imparting quality and value oriented education as well as promoting academic excellence.

### **Mission**

Habraghat Mahaviyalaya, Krishnai is a rural college that was established in 1979 with the mission of catering to the needs of higher education to the students predominantly belonging to minority, S.C., S.T., & O.B.C. communities which was the need of the time. As such we are committed to reach the following goals and objectives:

1. To provide necessary infrastructure and learning resources for imparting quality education leading to higher education.
2. To create job opportunities by introducing new subjects and professional courses.
3. To reach higher education to the unreached.
4. To develop a sense of unity, fraternity and equality in the students so that they become the ideal citizen for India tomorrow.
5. To develop self confidence and leadership qualities of the students as required to face the challenges of life through various competitions and programmes related to their practical life.
6. To strive for all round development of the students through extracurricular activities.
7. To work for personality development of the students and for moulding of national character.

## 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

### Institutional Strength

- The institution has sufficient campus area as well as buildup area.
- There is cordial relationship among the stakeholders.
- The administration of the institution is very transparent, effective, flexible and efficient.
- The employees of the College are a part of administration. Friendly management and commitment of the College administration towards students' interests have created a friendly and conducive atmosphere.
- The administrative policies are flexible to adopt and implement the strategies preferably on need based.
- Increasing use of technology by the institution has made the official works more easier and transparent.
- The institution is open for all categories of students without any discrimination and takes initiatives for holistic development of the students.
- The recruitment mechanism of the institution is transparent and efficient. Hence, the faculties are highly competent and dedicated towards their duties and responsibilities.
- The teachers are aware of the latest developments in higher education. They welcome innovative ideas beneficent to the students, society and the institution and they are also interested in research activities for their academic development.
- ICT facilities, smart classrooms and infrastructure facilities of the institution have improved the teaching learning process.
- Friendly policies of the institution, especially for girl students and students from economically weaker background have benefitted.
- The institution works for maintaining a green campus with planting huge number of Teak Wood and other Plants.
- The college is fully under 24x7 CCTV surveillance.
- The institution has a Language Lab, Two Computer Lab and a Psychological Lab.
- The Library of the college is well equipped and updated to meet all the needs of the teachers and students.
- NSS Unit of the Institution is very active.

### Institutional Weakness

- There is only one stream (Arts) in the College.
- The majority of the students are from poor socio-economic background.

- There is no auditorium building in the college.
- The College is in the crisis of Indoor Stadium.
- Number of teaching and non-teaching staffs is not sufficient.
- Number of boarders in the Hostels is negligible.

### **Institutional Opportunity**

- There is large campus area for introducing new streams and Post Graduate Courses.
- The Alumni Association of the college should be registered under Societies Registration Act and should take more initiatives for the greater interest of the college.
- There is an ample opportunity to introduce new departments and Job oriented/Vocational Courses under Government initiatives.
- For the benefit of the stakeholders some facilities like Bank, ATM, Sub-Post Office, Book Stall, etc. can be established in the college campus.
- There is a scope for installing solar power facilities in the college for creating an eco-friendly campus.
- The college has a scope to buildup an indoor stadium for providing well equipped sports complex and sports facilities.
- There is scope for collaboration with Industries and NGO's for the overall community development in the neighboring areas.
- The institution has scope for organizing more innovative and research works by obtaining grants from funding agencies for pursuing research works can improve the research culture in the college.

### **Institutional Challenge**

- Insufficient teaching and non-teaching staff for which it is difficult to complete the teaching as well as administrative activities within stipulated time.
- There is another challenge to implement FYUGP course as per NEP 2020 with a limited number of departments.
- It is difficult to maintain balance with curricular activities and co-curricular activities simultaneously required for all-round development of the students.
- Motivating students for higher education and competitive examinations.
- Difficult to keep pace with the students enrolled from poor and remote rural areas with the rapid growing higher educational scenario.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

### **Curricular Aspects**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai, is affiliated to Gauhati University and follows the curriculum prescribed by the affiliating university. The College runs only UG Arts Stream with 15 programmes at present. The College has introduced and implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic session: 2019-2020 and Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) under NEP-2020 w.e.f. Session: 2023-2024.

The College ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process keeping in mind the programme outcomes and course outcomes. The Principal invites a staff meeting at the beginning of

academic session and prepares a road-map for the entire academic session, such as- preparation of academic calendar and class routine, college prospectus, organization of orientation programme, formation of different committees, mentor-mentee mechanism, etc.

For effective implementation of curriculum, the college applies different methods in addition of traditional lecture method, such as- group discussion, seminar/workshop, academic expert meet, faculty exchange programme, participative learning, experiential learning, project work and field visit, etc. Besides, the teachers use online modes like Google classroom, Zoom, Google Meet, etc. The teachers use ICT enabled classrooms as well as smart classrooms for effective teaching learning along with traditional classes. Moreover, there are facilities of E-Contents available for students in the college website and Digital Library website. The College conducts continuous internal assessment on the basis of class attendance, home assignment and Sessional tests.

The college offers Skill Oriented Certificate Course and Value Added Courses in each academic session. The respective departments with due permission select courses, design syllabus, teach, conduct evaluation and issue completion certificates.

The College integrates crosscutting issues relevant to professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability in transacting the curriculum. Besides the prescribed curriculum and syllabus, the college efforts to integrate various cross-cutting issues through various programmes and activities catering the need and importance of the rural masses. Some departments offer project work/field works. The students submit reports on project work/field work as per guidance/supervision of the faculty of the respective departments.

The college collects feedback on curriculum and its delivery from various stakeholders, analyses, takes action and uploads on the college website.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai, being a rural college situated in an area inhabited by people predominantly belonging to SC, ST, OBC & Minority Communities, has one of its main objectives to cater the needs of higher education to these people. The College adopts a transparent admission procedure and strictly follows the existing reservation policy of the Government for ensuring the enrollment of students from diverse socio-economic background and learning abilities. The average enrolment percentage of the students is 97.07% and 44.13% against reserved categories during last five years. The student-teacher ratio is 21:1.

The College lays importance on **Student-Centric Method** in teaching-learning. It encourages the students in active participation in teaching-learning and employs Experiential Learning Method, Participative Learning Method and Problem Solving Method along with Lecture Method. The college campus is fully Wi-Fi enabled. The teachers use Projectors, Smart Classrooms and other computing equipments for effective teaching-learning. Moreover, some teachers use virtual platforms like-Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Meet, etc. The Central Library of the College is updated with **N-LIST, in INFLIBNET** in which **E-Books, E-Journals**, etc. Besides, Study Materials like Recorded videos, Question Bank, PPT Bank, PDF Notes, etc. are available in the college website for students.

The average percentage of full-time teachers against sanctioned posts is 78.10% during last five years of which 37.38% are with NET/SLET/Ph.D.

The College follows transparent mechanism of internal and external assessment as per guidelines of the

affiliating university. In UG programme 20% is assigned for internal assessment and 80% for external assessment i.e., semester end examination. The internal assessment is done on the basis of class attendance, Home assignment and Sessional Test and grievances related to internal assessment are redressed at institutional level.

Programme Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) for all programmes are displayed on the departmental notice board and the college website. Attainment of POs and COs are assessed following continuous and comprehensive evaluation by class assignment, home assignment, Sessional tests, group discussion, mentor-mentee mechanism, external examination, feedback collection, student satisfaction survey and progression to higher education. The pass percentage of students during last five years is 81.67%.

### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, as an affiliated college under Gauhati University is essentially a teaching unit, though it has been taking initiatives for research, innovation and extension activities. The college has an **Innovation Council** and **Intellectual Property Right Cell** which have been working for healthy innovation ecosystem.

The College organizes Workshops, Seminars and Conferences time to time. It has organized 21 such activities during last five years. The faculty members of the college have more or less engaged themselves in publication and research culture, yet 7 numbers of teachers have published research papers in the journals as notified on UGC-CARE list during last five years and 46 numbers of teachers have published papers in books and chapters in edited volumes with ISBN number. 2 numbers of books with ISBN number have been published under the initiative of IQAC of the college entitled “**Prabandha Karani**” in 2019 and “**MELANGE**” in 2021. The NSS-Unit and Extension Education Cell of the college have organized 45 numbers of extension and outreach programmes with involvement of communities during last five years, which have sensitized the students to social issues for their holistic development. Some of such important programmes are- Voluntary Blood Donation Camp, Covid-19 Vaccination Camp, Japanese Encephalitis Vaccination Camp, Swachhata Mission, Establishment of Rural Bio-Resource Complex, Plantation Programme, etc. for which the NSS-Unit of the college have been appreciated/recognized severally.

The college has 10 functional MoUs with other universities, colleges and institutions to undertake Student/faculty exchange programmes and collaborative research activities. The College has conducted 35 numbers of collaborative activities during last five years.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai, has a barrier-free and eco-friendly environment with 37.5 Acres of campus area and 7245.32 square meters of build up area. The College has adequate infrastructure and facilities for teaching- learning with 17 classrooms, out of which 6 are ICT enabled and 2 are smart classrooms and 3 numbers of well equipped Laboratories. The college has separate Principal’s office, IQAC Office, Vice Principal’s office, Office Rooms, Departmental Common Rooms, Examination Control Room, Distance Learning Centres, Canteen, Office of the Students’ Union, NSS-Unit, Boys’ Common Room, Girls’ Common Room, 2 Hostels, Seminar Hall, Gym Centre, Office of the Extension Education Cell, Office the Guidance and Career Counseling Cell, Teachers Common Room, Office of the Alumni, Car parking, Cycle Shed, Ramp Facility, Pure Drinking Water Facilities, 24x7 Hours CCTV Surveillance, Wi-Fi enabled Campus as a means of

facilitating teaching-learning process and support services. College has a large play ground for games and Sports. 69.55% of the total expenditure excluding salary has been utilized for infrastructure development and augmentation.

The Central Library is located in the first floor of Block-C spreading in an area of 6505 sq/feet which includes two Reading Rooms- one for students and the other for teachers, Reference section and one **E-Resource Centre**. It has a collection of **16885+ printed books** (Text Books and Reference Books), **10 Periodicals including 4 journals, 52 Manuscripts and 5 national and regional news papers**. It has an **Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) SOUL 2.00**. It provides access to e-resources through **N-LIST** as a part of **INFLIBNET**. The users can access **195000+ e-books and 6000+ e-journals**, further the users can access e-books through free **NDLI**. The **Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC)** facility is installed in 2016. It has **D-Space Software** which is an open access electronic archive for collecting, preserving and distributing digital materials. There are a total of 88 computers and Laptops, 6 Projectors, 2 Interactive Panels, 2 Smart TV, 4 Wi-Fi connections with 50 MBPS, 1 Bio-metric, 9 Printers and Scanners, 2 xerox machines in the college. Out of 88 computers 54 are meant for students' uses. Student -computers ratio is 8:1.

### **Student Support and Progression**

The College provides necessary support services to the students for acquiring learning experiences as well as for holistic development. The College supports the students to be benefitted by scholarship and freeships provided by the institution, Government-Scheme, etc. 80.54% of the students have been benefitted by scholarship and freeships. The college has organized 13 numbers of capacity development and skill enhancement activities during last five years for improving student's capacity of Soft Skills, Language and Communication Skills, Life skills and ICT skills. The Guidance and Career Counseling Cell of the College organizes guidance for Competitive Examinations, TET Coaching, Remedial Classes, etc. As a result 18.85% of students have been benefitted during last five years. The college has one active Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee and one Anti Ragging Committee for timely redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging. The college takes initiatives for placement and progression of the outgoing students by Guidance and Career Counseling Cell. For holistic development of the students the college organizes various sports and cultural activities and encourages the students to participate in different events and meets in and outside of the college. The College provides necessary supports to the participate in the games & sports organized by other colleges, universities and organizations. As a result of which 3 numbers of students able shows their excellence in the **2nd International Karate Championship-2019** by wining **Gold Medal** in different weight categories.

The College has maintained good relation with the communities and ex-students. It has an active Alumni Association. The association has contributed to the development of the college through financial as well as other support services by organizing various programmes.

### **Governance, Leadership and Management**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya believes in transparent governance policies. The College is governed by the Governing Body(GB), formed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Assam. GB is the Apex Body of the College that plans policies as per the rules and regulations of the Department of Higher Education and executes the developmental activities of the College. The plans and policies are framed by GB, involving various stakeholders to achieve the vision. GB, IQAC and the faculty members play important role in designing

and implementing quality policies in governance, management, teaching-learning, research and extension activities.

The College follows practices of decentralization and participative management system which is evident from its policies, administrative setup, appointment, service rules and procedures, etc. The College implements e-governance in its operations regarding Administration, Financial Accounts, Students Admission and Supports and Examinations. The College facilitates professional growth of employees via implementing worthwhile **Performance Based Appraisal System** framed by the Director of Higher Education (DHE), Assam. It has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff and avenues for career development and progression by providing financial support. The teaching and non-teaching staff participates in Faculty Development Programme, Refresher's Course and Orientation Programme for updating their professional competency.

The College adheres with the financial rules and guidelines as laid down by the Government of Assam. The College made its best efforts for getting funds and financial grants from **Government of Assam** and different granting agencies such as- **UGC, RUSA and other sources for holistic development of the institution. The College adopts** a fair and transparent method for mobilization of resources and optimal utilization of funds. It conducts **Internal Financial Audits** periodically by reviewing and cross checking of all expenditures and payments through internal auditors and **External Financial Audits** by a **Chartered Accountant (CA)**

**The IQAC of the College undertakes quality initiatives for quality sustenance and enhancement among all the stakeholders. The significant quality assurance initiatives are holding of regular meetings of IQAC, Academic and Administrative Audits, Collaborative Activities, etc.**

### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya tries to inculcate human values among the students through various practices. It believes on equity and equal development without any discrimination of gender. It looks in to gender equity & sensitization through curricular and co-curricular activities, facilities for women in the campus and other activities. With this purpose in view the college has set up a **Women Cell** and formed a **Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee** and has been taking various initiatives every year for the promotion of gender equity. The college has conducted 12 programmes/activities on sensitization of gender equity. The gender equity & sensitization initiatives are reflected in the **Gender Audit, 2018-19 to 2022-23.**

The college believes on the principle of **"Nurture Nature for future"**. Hence, the College focuses on the energy saving practices and Green Campus initiatives, which are reflected in the **Energy Audit and Green Audit** from 2018-19 to 2022-23. The institution has facilities and initiatives for green campus, energy saving measures, water conservation, disabled-friendly, barrier free environment etc. To maintain green campus, the college adopts various initiatives, like- plantation programme, installation of Nutri Garden, Herbal Medicinal Plant Garden, Teak Wood Plant, Rain Water Harvesting, use of LED bulb, etc. Besides, the college undertakes various environmental awareness programmes in and outside of the college campus. The College believes on 'Unity in Diversity' among the stakeholders and provides an inclusive environment to create communal harmony and tolerance by organizing various cultural programmes and celebrating national and international days. The college follows its own **code of conduct** which is displayed in the college prospectus and website and sensitizes the stakeholders toward the **code of conduct.**

The College strictly follows the course and curriculum prescribed by the affiliating university. The institution not only takes initiatives in curricular activities, it also takes initiatives by offering co-curricular activities and add-on courses. These initiatives offer students a chance for holistic understanding on other disciplines. The College has introduced many interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary courses as per guidelines of the affiliating University i.e. Gauhati University from the Academic Session-2023-24 with a view to implement the NEP-2020. Now students have to select one Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), one Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), one Value Added Course (VAC), one Multidisciplinary Course (MDC) according to their choice. Besides, the NSS Unit of the College takes initiatives to participate the students in various community extension activities in the college, nearby schools and villages such as- Swachha Bharat Abhiyan, women empowerment, Blood Donation Camp, Vaccination, environmental awareness programmes, etc. Moreover, various days, ceremonies, festivals and programmes are organized in the college so that the students can go the surrounding areas and to meet the community.</p>
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	<p>Being affiliated to Gauhati University, Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai adheres to the rules and regulations of the affiliating university, issues course completion certificates to the students. Considering the implementation of NEP-2020 the college has taken measures to register the students of BA 1st Semester (FYUGP) for ABC ID w.e.f. Academic Session- 2023-2024. Subsequently, the students have got ABC ID Cards which are approved by the Principal of the College and uploaded in the SAMARTH PORTAL.</p>
3. Skill development:	<p>Skill development is one of the most important areas, where Habraghat Mahavidyalaya strives to excell. The College has been continuing several skill-oriented Courses for capacity building of the students since 2016-17. Such as- Certificate Course in Computer Application (CCA), Skill Oriented Certificate Course (SOCC) by each department in Odd Semester, Value-Added Course (VAC) by each department in Even Semester. From the Academic</p>

	<p>Session-2023-24 the College has introduced subject-wise Skill Enhancement Courses with the conformity of the guidelines of the affiliating University as per provisions for implementation of NEP-2020. The Skill Enhancement Courses, introduced in the College, are- Asamiya Akhar Jotani, Data Collection and Presentation, Fundamentals of Disaster Management, Gender Sensitization, Panchayati Raj in Practice, Mental Health and Hygiene, Spoken Arabic, Byabaharik Asomiya, CV Writing and Interview Skill, etc. Students are encouraged to take at least on vocational course in online mode through SWAYAM, MOOCs, etc. The College has signed various MoUs with academic institutions and industrial agencies to provide a platform for skill mapping of the students. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):</p>	<p>The affiliating University frames and publishes the syllabi of all the courses of its affiliated colleges keeping in view the latest knowledge requirements. The syllabi mention the course outcomes. The College encourages student centric teaching-learning method for outcome based education. In the beginning of the academic session the College organizes orientation programme for students on programme outcome(PO), Course Outcomes(COs) and Programme Specific Outcomes(PSOs) which are uploaded in the College website. For attainment of programme outcomes as well as learning outcomes the college conducts continuous evaluations based on periodic test, surprise test, oral test, open book test, unit test, etc. The College emphasizes on experiential learning methods like- Field Study, Industry Visit, Visit to Higher Educational Institutions, etc. With regards to participative learning the College gives importance on hands-on training, team teaching, preparation of wall magazine, seminar, debate and quiz. Besides, Group discussion and Project works are implemented as problem solving activity. The teachers develop Teaching Learning Materials for the students, use ICT enabled classroom, Smart Classroom, Language Laboratory, Computer Lab and Psychological Lab as and when required, provide study materials like- PDF, Video Lectures, Recorded video, Downloaded Videos, Question Bank, etc. to students for learning.</p>

- The College organizes **Orientation Programme** for the newly admitted students.
- The **Routine Committee** prepares the **central class routine** for the session.
- The HoD of each Department prepares the **Departmental Class Routine, Unit Plan and Lesson Plan** in consultation with all the faculty members of the departments and allots classes.
- The departments maintain **Class Attendance Register** where the faculty members keep record of classes, units of syllabus taught on daily basis which helps to assess the progress of the course and ensures curriculum delivery.
- **Mentor-Mentee Mechanism** with special emphasis on advance learner, slow learner as well as remedial classes is implemented.
- For effective implementation of curriculum **Group Discussion, Departmental Seminar/Workshop, Academic Expert Meet and Industry Visit** are organized.
- The teachers use **ICT Enabled Classroom** as well as **Smart Classroom** for effective teaching-learning, along with traditional classes.
- **Participative Learning, Experiential Learning, Project Work and Field Work** in addition of lecture method are used.
- During **Covid-19 Pandemic** the teachers taught through **online Modes** using **Google Classroom, Google Meet and Zoom**. Study materials, recorded videos, downloaded videos, question bank; PPT, etc. are also provided to the students which are available in the digital library website.

## 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

### 2.5.1

**Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient**

**Response:**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya follows transparent mechanism of internal/external assessment. Internal and external assessments are conducted as per academic calendar and guidelines of the affiliating university.

**Mechanism of Internal/External Assessment:**

- Internal and external assessment is conducted as per guidelines of the affiliating university. As per guidelines, in each paper in UG programme 20% is assigned for internal assessment and 80% is assigned for external assessment i.e., semester end examination.
- The mechanism and the criteria for internal and external assessment are informed the students through university website, college website, syllabus, orientation and class counseling.
- The internal assessment is based on the class attendance of the students and Sessional Examination, Home assignment, etc.
- For smooth conduct of the Sessional Test there is a conduct committee constituted as per decision of the meeting of the faculty members presided over by the Principal. The meeting also appoints an Assistant Officer In-charge to make necessary arrangements for collection of question papers, maintaining proper records of attendance, evaluations, etc. The examination is held as per schedule prepared for the purpose and the relevant information regarding the Sessional Test are notified in advance in the notice board of the College.
- Class tests and Home assignment are conducted by the concerned departments.
- Students' attendance records are properly maintained by concern departments and periodically displayed on the notice board. As per guidelines, 75% attendance of the students is essential for appearing external examination conducted by the affiliating university.

- After evaluation of answer scripts of sessional examination the answer scripts are shown to the students with detailed marks and remarks and suggestions for improvement.
- Finally, the obtained marks of internal assessment of the students are uploaded in the online portal of the university.

### Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

- Grievance Redressal Mechanism of the college is time bound and efficient.
- Grievances are redressed at institutional level and university level. Grievances related to internal assessment are redressed at institutional level and Grievances related to Semester end examinations are redressed at University level.
- At the institutional level, there is a Grievance Redressal Committee under the Chairmanship of the Principal of the College. Students can drop their writing complaints relating to examination in the grievance drop box. The committee resolves the grievance through due procedure.
- The Committee holds a meeting under the chairmanship of the Principal and discusses the grievances of the complainants relating to attendance and marks obtained in the sessional examination, along with the respective head of the departments and resolve the issues.
- Students grievances related to external assessment i.e., semester end examinations and results are redressed at the university level.
- For this purpose the students submit an application to the principal stating the grievance. The Principal takes the initiation by forwarding the application to the University for necessary actions.
- If the students are not satisfied, they may apply for re-evaluation in a prescribed proforma to university and the university takes further actions.

## 2.6 Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

### 2.6.1

#### Response:

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai offers only TDC/FYUGP (Arts) Major/Honours and Regular/General programme. The Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) are uploaded on the college website. To achieve the POs, the COs are designed on the basis of Objectives of Blooms Taxonomy- Cognitive Domain, Affective Domain and Conative Domain.

The POs include- Knowledge, Understanding, Thinking, Communication, Social Interaction, Intelligence and creativity, Character and Personality, Good Citizen, Ethics and Morality, Nationalism and International understanding, Environment and Sustainability, Self-direction and Life-long Learning, Preparation for the world of work. The COs of each courses are prescribed in the syllabi.

#### **Mechanism of Communication of POs and COs:**

- The Institution has an effective mechanism to communicate the teachers and students about the Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes. The Principal convenes a meeting with the IQAC and Head of the Departments in the beginning of the session to discuss about POs and COs and any changes of the courses. If, any changes in the course the respective HoDs are requested to update the COs. The IQAC updates the POs and COs in the institutional website.
- The HoDs hold Departmental meeting and discuss about the POs, PSOs, COs and changes of the course if any.
- Faculties are requested to visit the institutional website as well as syllabi of the courses to acquaint with the current POs, PSOs and COs.
- IQAC conducts meet with the faculties to acquaint them about the POs, PSOs and COs and suggests them to adopt effective strategies so that the students can attain the objectives.
- To communicate the students with the POs and COs, IQAC of the college organize orientation programme for the newly enrolled students at the beginning of the academic session and discusses about the POs and COs. In addition to this, students are suggested to visit the institution's website, syllabi and to meet the departmental teachers.
- The departmental faculties are also requested to make clear the students about the POs, PSOs and COs during teaching.
- Faculty members, during the class hours inform the students about the scope and extend of the courses and its future opportunities. At the same time the faculties discuss about the Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes.
- Further the departments display the POs, PSOs and COs on the departmental notice board.

**Response:**

- Habraghat Mahavidyalaya offers courses in Humanities and Social Science in Arts Stream under UG (TDC/FYUGP) Programme. There are 7 (Seven) departments/subjects in major/honours and

general/regular courses. The teaching faculties teach the courses keeping in mind POs, PSOs and COs, so that the students can attain the same of their concerned subject.

- The Institution follows different methods and mechanisms of assessment for the attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes on the basis of students' acquired knowledge, skills and abilities.
- The IQAC discusses and analyze the results of assessment and evaluation of the outcomes and suggests measures to improve teaching learning process to attain the desired POs and COs.

#### Methods and mechanism of Assessment:

- The Institution adopts **Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE)** to assess the students.
- For attainment of the outcomes the institution conducts **Class Assignment, Open Book Test, Sessional Test and External Examination.**
- Tests are administered keeping in view the objectives of the courses, so that the outcomes of the students can be assessed.
- Students' performance in the regularly conducted **Group Discussion, Seminar, Workshop, etc.** is also used as a measure to assess the attainment of their learning levels.
- There is a **Mentor-Mentee Mechanism** with special emphasis on advance learners and slow learners. Students are grouped under mentors, who look into the performance of the students and assess them as well as takes initiatives for improvement.
- The institution has an effective **Mechanism** for **collecting Feedback** from students and alumni on curriculum, teaching-learning and teachers, which is also used as a tool to improve the attainment level of POs and COs of the students.
- Students' performance in **external examination** i.e. Final Semester examination is also used as an indicator of assessing the attainment level of learning of the students.
- Further, details of **Students' progression to higher studies** in different institutions, is also used as a tool of assessment of outcomes.

#### Response:

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya, Krishnai, has a barrier-free and eco-friendly environment with 37.5 Acres of campus area and 7245.32 square meters of build up area. The College has adequate infrastructure and facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc. to enhance the quality of teaching-learning. Even the College expands its infrastructure systematically and continuously over the years as per requirement.

- **Classroom:** There are 17 classrooms in the college, out of which 6 are ICT enabled classrooms and 2 are smart classrooms. The classrooms are of different dimensions adequate to accommodate the strength of students.
- **Learning Management System (LMS):** There is a Learning Management System embedded with the website <http://habraghatcollege.digitallibrary.co.in/> of the Digital Library of the college, where PPTs, Study Materials, Recorded Videos, Downloaded Videos, Question Bank, etc. are uploaded.
- **Laboratory:** The College has 3 well equipped laboratories, out of which one is Language Lab, one is Computer Lab and one is Psychological Lab. The Language Lab and the Computer Lab is well equipped with computers having Wi-Fi and LAN facility. The Psychological Laboratory is well-equipped with 13 Tachistoscopes, 7 Memory Drum Apparatuses, 8 Mirror Drawing Apparatuses, 21 Stopwatches, Screens, Maze Learning Apparatus, Puzzle Boxes.
- **Computing Equipments:** There are total 88 computers, 8 Printers, 5 Scanners and 2 Xerox machines in the College at present.
- **Cultural Facilities:** There are adequate facilities to foster the cultural potentialities of the students by organizing various cultural activities, such as- Classical Music, Folk Songs, Dances, Bride-Groom Competitions, Traditional Dress Competition, Cultural Rallies, etc.
- **YOGA Practice:** The IQAC and NSS Unit of the College provide facilities for organizing Workshops on YOGA and celebration of International Yoga Day every year.
- **Games and Spots Facilities:** The College has a spacious playground for Football, Cricket and athletics. There are separate Courts for Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, and Kabaddi.
- **Gymnasium:** There is a well-equipped GYM Centre with Multi-Gym facilities and instructor to create sound body and mind of the students and faculties.
- **Seminar Hall:** There is an ICT enabled Seminar Hall with 100 seating capacity to hold meetings,

#### Response:

The administrative activities are controlled by Director of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam and academic activities are controlled by its affiliating university.

The College follows practices of decentralization and participative management system which is evident from its policies, administrative setup, appointment, service rules and procedures etc.

#### Policies:

To realize the vision and mission, the college prepares various policies, like- Admission Policy, Academic Policy, Infrastructure and Maintenance Policy, Student Support Policy, Faculty Empowerment Policy, Grievance Redressal Policy, Anti-Ragging Policy, Anti-Sexual Harassment Policy, Green Campus Policy, etc.

#### Administrative Setup:

- Governing Body is the apex body of the college which is at the top of the administrative set up.
- Principal of the College executes all the administrative activities of the College with the approval

of the GB.

- Vice Principal of the College, and ex-officio member of the GB works under the principal and looks into the academic activities of the College.
- IQAC of the College functions as driving force of ensuring quality as well as all-round development of the College in consultation with various sub-committees.
- Head of the Departments are responsible for looking after respective departments.
- Librarian is the head and custodian of the Central Library, who is the ex-officio member of GB and works with the support of library staff.
- The Office of the College works under Principal with a Senior Assistant who is supported by Junior Assistants, office Bearer and IV-Grade staff.

### **Appointment:**

All recruitments are made as per UGC guideline and rule of Director of Higher Education (DHE), Govt. of Assam. The advertisement for filling up of a post is published in the Reading News Papers by the Principal with the approval of GB. The GB is entrusted with the authority to complete the interview process and the final appointment is made by the DHE, Assam as per proposal and recommendation of GB.

### **Service Rules and Procedures:**

The College adheres with the service rules and regulations lay down by the DHE, Govt. of Assam. In case of promotion of the teaching staff. The Principal forms Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) and holds DPC meetings for promotion after approval of the Vice-Chancellor of the affiliating university. Then the Principal submits the proposal to DHE with approval of the GB and finally the DHE approves the proposal.

- The institution receives funds and financial grants from **Government of Assam** and different granting agencies such as- **UGC** and **RUSA**. Besides, the institution generates funds from following sources:

3. **Distance and Open learning Centres under KKHSOU and IDOL**
4. **College Canteen**
5. **Contribution and donation from Alumni and individuals**
6. **Interests accrued from bank balance**

- Major financial transactions are made through online mode. Salary and other financial benefits disbursement to the employees are made through **FINASSAM** portal and District Treasury, Goalpara.
- The institution adopts a fair and transparent method for mobilization of resources and optimal utilization of funds. Funds are utilized by DDO, the Principal with prior and post permission of the Governing Body. The Governing Body monitors utilization of all grants and funds for



development of infrastructure as well as augmentation.

- For optimal utilization of resources the institution Bids through tender in print media and institutional website before purchasing of some products.
- All purchases are done through purchase committee and construction committee under the monitoring of Governing Body following the rules for purchases.
- After the completion of the construction and purchasing of products a utilization certificate with authentic and verifiable proof of expenditure details are submitted to the Principal which are scrutinized by internal and external government auditing agency.
- The institution has an Accounts Branch headed by the Principal cum DDO, who is assisted by a Senior Assistant, keeps records of all expenditures and payments with valid documentation. It conducts **Internal Financial Audits** periodically by reviewing and cross checking of all expenditures and payments through internal auditors appointed by the authority.
- Moreover, the institution conducts **External Financial Audits** by a **Chartered Accountant (CA)** to maintain highest level of trust, transparency and integrity. The audit reports are submitted to the concerned authority. Audit objections if any, are considered carefully and appropriate explanations are made immediately through a written report and rectifications, if any, are made in the next financial year.

#### **Response:**

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya is very concerned towards the gender sensitization. It takes various measures for the promotion of gender equity. It looks in to gender equity & sensitization through curricular and co-curricular activities, facilities for women in the campus and other activities. With this purpose in view the college has set up a **Women Cell** and formed a **Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee**. The college has been taking various initiatives every year for the promotion of gender equity.

- **Gender Audit** indicates a decline of gender gap in student strength. The Percentage of enrollment of female students were 57.90%, in 2018-19. the percentage of female students increased to 61.11% in 2022-23.
- Number of women in teaching staff is increased from 13.64% in 2018-19 to 19.05% in 2022-23.
- Gender Sensitization belongs to the curricular activities offered in the College as per instruction of its affiliating University. Courses offered in Social Science disciplines have modules of gender studies, for instances, **Women and Society- EDU-RE-6046** (Department of Education), **Womens Writing- ENG-HC-5026** (Department of English) and **Feminism: Theory and Practice- POL-06-02** (Department of Political Science)
- Each **Cell/Committee** of Habraghat Mahavidyalaya ensures inclusion of woman member.
- **Women Cell** and **Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee** receive complaints of sexual harassment, make inquiry and takes time bound actions. The college promotes **Zero tolerance** for any form of discrimination in the campus.
- Administration of the College is sensitive to health concerns of women employees' pre and post partum. **Maternity and Child Care Leave** is sanctioned as per Government rules.
- The College has one **girls' Common Room** equipped with adequate washrooms, running water facility, drinking water facility and vending machine with sanitary pad. In addition there are 4 separate washrooms for women.
- One member of Students Union i.e. secretary of the **Girls' Common room** is reserved for woman.
- The college has a **well-equipped gym centre**. One female instructor is appointed for encouraging the girls' students.
- The College has a Girls Hostel with capacity of having 56 boarders.
- Entire College is under the Surveillance of CCTV for ensuring 24x7 safety and security.

## 1. Title of the Practice: SELF-EMPLOYMENT GENERATION

### 2. Objective of the Practice:

- To help students realize the value of self-employment.
- To develop professional behavior among students and people in neighboring villages.
- To cultivate diverse skills among students.
- To foster economic independence among participants.
- To organize practical skill-building programs for self-employment.

### 3. The Context:

In response to the pervasive unemployment issue in society, the college aims to instill ideas of job opportunities and self-employment among students and nearby communities. Coordinated by the IQAC and NSS Unit, the college has conducted various awareness and practical programs both on-campus and off-campus. Key initiatives include:

- Awareness program on "Establishment of Rural Bio-Resource Complex through Integrated Aqua-Culture Practices at Goalpara, an aspirational district of Assam," sponsored by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India and the Department of Zoology, Gauhati University.
- Digital Awareness Program for Students, Women, Farmers, and Elderly People.(13-06-2022 to 15-06-2022)
- Economic Literacy Awareness by SBI Goalpara. (30-06-2022)
- IBM Skills Build program.(27-03-2023)
- Certificate Course in Computer Application (CCA)

### 4. The Practice:

The aquaculture project has been implemented in several phases:

- Initial planning and startup meeting with the college faculties was held on 11th Feb 2022.
- Follow up meetings with the faculties of the college were conducted. The faculties from the localities arranged different meetings with people from different areas in Goalpara in order to know about their interest in the project. Further, Dr. Ibrahim Ali Bhuyan has been selected as the representative of the college.
- Final meeting with stakeholders was held on 30th August 2022. In the meeting, the stakeholders' details were recorded for further procedure.
- Dr. Bhuyan along with the sponsor's representative visited sites and made selection of pond locations and decided on suitable fish species.
- Lastly fishes are delivered to beneficiaries and monitoring of fish growth and pond conditions is regularly done.
- Additionally, 3 days digital awareness program was conducted for students, farmer, women and elderly people from 13-06-2022 to 15-06-2022 to enhance their knowledge on digital need in today's market culture.
- Moreover, economic literacy sessions, IBM Skills Build initiatives, and CCA courses have been systematically organized to equip participants with essential skills for self-employment.

### 5. Evidence of Success:



- Increased number of beneficiaries deriving economic benefits from the aquaculture project.
- Enhanced skills and scientific knowledge among participants in fish farming practices.
- Successful completion and certification of CCA courses benefiting students in various professional fields.
- Improved digital literacy and skill development outcomes observed among participants across different sectors.

## **6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

Challenges faced include the risk aversion and fear of failure among students venturing into self-employment. Adequate funding, time, expert guidance, and sustained engagement were crucial resources required for successful implementation. Despite challenges, the college has strived to meet these requirements, successfully fostering a sense of self-employment among a significant number of students, with ongoing plans for future enhancements.

- Faculty members are involved as External Examiner, Interview Experts and Evaluator in neighboring colleges and institutions.
- The faculties of the college help the Election Commission during Parliamentary, Assembly and other Elections as Master Trainers and Polling Personals.

### Concluding Remarks :

Habraghat Mahavidyalaya started its journey since the inception in 1979 with the maxim "**Tamso Ma Jyotirgamaya**" which means "**Lead us from darkness to light**" and the college has been trying to achieve the maxim with the whole hearted cooperation from all the stakeholders and optimal use of resources available.
